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bigger than him. Reported numerous times to Mr. Claybourn and he said, he's just one of those kids and there is nothing he can do about it. He now has low self-esteem. Of course my son and the kid are friends and says we're just playing. Last week at the dance he and the kid were horse playing around and he got a detention. I emailed Mr. Ford saying its not fair that after fight at a dance he gets detention and is banned from talent show that his sister is in and cops would be called if we showed up. I was prepared to be arrested but Administration conceded on attendance at talent show. I have a lot of feedback on Facebook stating how people's kids are being wrongfully punished. My daughter was singled out and was told to move to a trouble table. She got up and moved to the trouble table. She shouldn't have done that. I do not feel my children are being treated fairly at the school district.
