 - I spoke Chuck at the borough and he has told me that the drainage and grading projects should be done simultaneously to ensure project integrity. I have also been informed that the project will take longer than a week to complete therefore cannot be done over spring break. Furthermore, in an effort to keep costs down by taking advantage of shared services and bidding our projects with those of the borough, we must wait until the summer to complete them as that is when the borough anticipates going out to bid. That being said, the drainage/grading projects have been budgeted to commence in the summer. The shared service agreement with the Borough of Somerdale is on tonight's agenda for approval.
 - I want to give you an update on our Joint Purchasing activities. Trenton Public School District has joined to take advantage of our purchasing network with Level Data and Advanced Computer Solutions Group. The District's net revenue from Trenton's services is \$6,173.30 after commissions.
