**Melissa Reitano, 31 Lafayette Avenue, Somerdale** – Question on finance #12. What is the electronic hall pass and why are we spending the money for this? The children have schedules and we know who they are with during the day. They are with an adult other than being in the bathroom. How can we drop \$3,000 on this and keep coming up with money for fluff things like this but cannot get a child study team director?

Dr. Vespe – The electronic hall pass monitors the time the kids are in the hallways and lets us know where they are supposed to be; it is not fluff. It gives us electronic time stamps and data reports because we have issues where some students are getting out every period to go to the bathroom; it also adds a measure of security, it is not fluff and that is why we are going to spend the money on it. It's used as an application on the laptop. A student logs in to notify the teacher then the teacher acknowledges. When the student comes back they log back in.

Michele Witmore, 81 Franklin Circle, Somerdale – Is the hall pass applicable to kindergarteners as well? (Dr. Vespe, "It will be, we will start off with middle school"). I do not think this is fluff; I am happy to hear about the program but I do think [her] issue should be addressed with regards to the head of child study team.

**Kim Ehm, 12 McMichael Court, Somerdale**: About the Connect Ed. While I love hearing Mr. Ford's voice every day, can we not have them during the day. It scares parents that something is wrong. Does board need approval for PTA presentation on IEP versus 504 as part of the parent advisory thing? [No]

**Bill Stain, 612 S. White Horse Pike, Somerdale**: Is there any contingency plan other than a new parking lot that is being discussed? Parking on Chestnut is going to be worse without parking on one side. Can we stager dismissal times? Mr. Phillips – I understand, per Jim, that you can park in the business areas during that time. It is a dangerous situation out there with cars coming from both sides and people pulling out into traffic. Someone is going to get hurt or killed. The inconvenience that parents have to walk a little bit far outweighs the possibilities of worst case scenarios.

Mrs. Lowden – Double check with Jim to make sure that is the case [parking in business lots] and maybe put out a Connect Ed about the situation and tell them if it is fine.

Education will go into closed session for the following reason(s) as outlined in N.J.S.A. 10:4-12(b):
Any matter which, by express provision of Federal Law, State Statute or Rule of Court shall be rendered
confidential or excluded from discussion in public
Any matter in which the release of information would impair a right to receive funds from the federal
government;
Any matter the disclosure of which constitutes an unwarranted invasion of individual privacy such as any
records, data, reports, recommendations, or other personal material of any educational, training, social
service, medical, health, custodial, child protection, rehabilitation, legal defense, welfare, housing, relocation,
insurance and similar program or institution operated by a public body pertaining to any specific individual
admitted to or served by such institution or program, including but not limited to information relative to the
individual's personal and family circumstances, and any material pertaining to admission, discharge,
treatment, progress or condition of any individual, unless the individual concerned (or, in the case of a minor
or incompetent, his guardian) shall request in writing that the same be disclosed publically;
Any collective bargaining agreement, or the terms and conditions of which are proposed for inclusion in any
collective bargaining agreement, including the negotiation of terms and conditions with employees or
representatives of employees of the public body
Any matter involving the purpose, lease or acquisition of real property with public funds, the setting of bank
rates or investment of public funds where it could adversely affect the public interest if discussion of such matters were disclosed;
Any tactics and techniques utilized in protecting the safety and property of the public provided that their
disclosure could impair such protection;
Any investigations of violations or possible violations of the law;
X Any pending or anticipated litigation or contract negotiation in which the public body is or may become a party.
Any matters falling within the attorney-client privilege, to the extent that confidentiality is required in order
for the attorney to exercise his ethical duties as a lawyer;
Any matter involving the employment, appointment, termination of employment, terms and conditions of
employment, evaluation of the performance, promotion or disciplining of any specific prospective public
officer or employee or current public officer or employee employed or appointed by the public body, unless
all individual employees or appointees whose rights could be adversely affected request in writing that such
matter or matters be discussed in public;
Any deliberation of a public body occurring after a public hearing that may result in the imposition of a specific
civil penalty upon the responding party or the suspension or loss of a license or permit belonging to the
responding party as a result of an act of omission for which the responding party bears responsibility;
WHEREAS, the length of the Executive Session is undetermined; however, the Somerdale Park Public
School District, Board of Education will make every attempt to estimate the time of the session prior to convening the
session after which the public meeting shall reconvene at pm and the Somerdale Park Public School District,
Board of Education will proceed with business.
NOW THEREFORE REIT RESOLVED, that the Somerdale Park Public School District, Roard of

Education will go into Executive Session for only the above stated reasons;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Somerdale Park Public School District, Board of Education hereby

declares that its discussion of the aforementioned subject(s) may be made public at a time when the Somerdale Park Public School District, Board of Education attorney advises that the disclosure of the discussion will not detrimentally affect any right, interest or duty of the school district or any other entity with respect to said discussion.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Somerdale Park Public School District, Board of Education, for the aforementioned reasons, hereby declares that the public is excluded from the portion of the meeting during which the above discussion shall take place and hereby directs the board secretary to take the appropriate action to effectuate the terms of this resolution.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Board Secretary on the next business day following this meeting, shall furnish a copy of this resolution to any member of the public who requests one at the fees allowed by N.J.S.A. 47:1A-1 et seq.
